BACKGROUND

More and more in an era of accountable care communities, shared savings, and attempting to make Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) information more actionable, attempts are being made to bridge health and human service worlds through data for health tools. The desired outcome of such efforts is better client/patient outcomes and closer connections between clinical and human services stakeholders in a community. Helping bridge this gap represents a frequently requested type of support and a prime opportunity for philanthropy like Telligen Community Initiative (TCI) to creatively assist.

This funding intentionally brings together NowPow and TCI to support community-based projects to make SDOH information more actionable. NowPow connects people to the right community resources so they can stay well, meet basic needs, manage with illness and care for others more effectively. NowPow's personalized community referral platform fits into existing workflows, making it easy for clinicians, case workers, resource coordinators, payers, and other organizations to make high-quality referrals to trusted community services.

SDOH can contribute to poorer health, and coordination between healthcare and community-based resources is pivotal to addressing these needs. However, our healthcare system remains poorly equipped to address SDOH. The potential of health information technology (HIT) to bridge this gap across the delivery of healthcare and social services is incredible, but too often its potential remains untapped. Considering the pandemic, this type of interconnectivity between health and social service worlds is more important than ever, allowing for new and innovative pathways to care for others utilizing community support services.

COLLABORATORS

TCI will evaluate and review the applicants and fund the cost of utilizing the NowPow technology. The awardees will partner with NowPow, which includes the software, set up and ongoing team support to set up a successful intervention.

NowPow, whose name is a play on "Knowledge is Power", is a women-owned and led technology business based on Chicago's south side. NowPow is a personalized community referral platform that makes it easy to connect people to high quality, highly matched referrals so they can stay well, meet basic needs, manage with illness and care for others. They build community referral networks of all sizes and sectors that power care for all people, drive measurable impact, and deliver data to bridge gaps in community care. As the only referral platform grounded in science, NowPow's referrals are evidence-based, person-centered and highly trusted to comprehensively address both health and social needs. NowPow's unique population health solution also provides deep community resource and referral insights to support process improvement, network health and quality, and care access and experience. NowPow helps people know where to go and builds the connections to get them there.

Telligen Community Initiative (TCI) is the charitable foundation founded in 2005 that provides philanthropic support to organizations and projects that strive to improve the health of communities. TCI's overall goal is to ensure opportunities for health are available and equitably accessible.

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OPPORTUNITY

The support of philanthropy to advance innovation and meaningful work to address SDOH has repeatedly led to requests based on the premise of connecting sectors – traditional health care to human/social service and educational counterparts – for the benefit of clients, patients, and community members. TCI and NowPow intentionally collaborated to jointly work on advancing viable solutions to this commonly requested community need. They have come together around this joint cause and are releasing this Special Funding Opportunity Request for Proposals to invite applicants from Illinois and Colorado to test this new funding process. Our hope is that by intentionally working together, grant investments in community-based projects seeking to work in this subject area can have greater potential for impact by 1) working directly with a solution like NowPow and having them involved in the review and sourcing of projects to invest in at the community level, 2) investing in projects from different kinds of communities and community teams to test this type of grant support, and 3) the results can be followed in a cohort, serial learning style with impacts and learnings aggregated across projects all using similar solutions as the basis for their community connecting work. This initiative will start in Illinois and Colorado only, but will evaluate if and how to advance to additional TCI supported states upon initial success.

PROJECT GOALS

Our goal for this collaboration is to move beyond the collection of SDOH needs data and drive actionable interventions, measure outcomes, and stand up a successful partnership between the health care and community provider sectors. This will be successful if we can help resource efforts in this space and learn together about what works best in advancing this type of community-connecting work. We collectively envision TCI philanthropic support to helping an applicant resource initial year start-up costs of engaging NowPow as a community referral management system.

PURPOSE OF THE RFP

The applications for this funding will be solicited and accepted from Colorado and Illinois-based projects on an open, rolling application deadline until funding is exhausted. We are anticipating the ability to fund six (6) to eight (8) overall projects in this special funding opportunity in the award range between \$50,000 and \$75,000.

You will notice in the application process that there is nothing expected from you regarding the development of a requested budget. TCI and NowPow are wanting the process to focus on strategic fit for how to utilize the potential of the NowPow platform as a referral management system. TCI's intent is the anticipated funding level between \$50,000 and \$75,000 per awardee/grantee will be sufficient to largely resource full set up and first year subscription costs with NowPow. This is intended to help resource your launch of efforts to make SDOH information more actionable for your clients/patients. NowPow will lead the project scoping and determination of the optimal grant size from TCI to your organization based on your information, their consultative support, and responses to this application process. The ongoing costs (after the initial grant support year) would be variable and dependent on individual project circumstances. NowPow will help you scope what anticipated future/ongoing costs might look like based on consultation with you for how to optimize the work with NowPow's platform in future years. The TCI grant support is intended to be for the first, highest cost experience with NowPow in the first year of your engagement.

The application process will open on March 1, 2021, and applications can be completed at any time after launch. We will close the funding review process once the available philanthropic pool of dollars has been fully awarded/obligated by winning community-based projects/proposal teams.

The unique collaboration between TCI and NowPow symbolizes the joint effort of two organizations that try to function at the intersections of health, medicine, technology, business, and innovation to foster community-driven, socially conscious impact. There is no set deadline, and your application can be submitted any time after the Special Funding Opportunity is released (March 1, 2021). Proposals will be reviewed and entertained by TCI and NowPow reviewers. TCI will determine the finalist and grantees, with the support of NowPow providing guidance in the evaluation. The proposals and awards will continue a rolling basis if and until all available funding is awarded. It is anticipated all awards will be made by the end of the third quarter of 2021.
